***Dr. Sue Williamson, Conductor***

Dr. Sue Williamson is an assistant professor of choral music education at CU Boulder. She received her Bachelor of Music Education from Ball State University, her Master of Music Education from the University of Colorado, and her Ph.D. in music education at the University of Washington.

Sue taught choral music in elementary, middle and high schools in Indiana, Ohio, Colorado and Washington. In addition, she conducted "Vivace" of the Northwest Girlchoir, an eighty-two voice auditioned choir in Seattle, Washington. She has presented choral clinics at MENC Conferences and the regional conference of the American Choral Directors Association.

She has been the featured honor choir conductor in festivals in Washington, Oregon, and British Columbia, Canada. She also has interests in the choral music of South Africa, where she conducted fieldwork in the summer of 1996.

***Emily Martin, Associate Conductor***

Emily Martin grew up in Denver and then Leadville, raised as an Episcopalian. She received her B.A. degree in Vocal and Instrumental Music Education, K-12, from Adams State College in Alamosa, Colorado.

She is currently in her 11th year of teaching choral music and drama to 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students at Louisville Middle School. Emily's choir was one of 3 middle school choirs in the state chosen to perform at the 2007 Colorado Music Educators' Convention this past January. Emily has founded the Louisville/Superior cluster Young Men's Festival and Middle Level Choral Festival, and co-founded the East Boulder Valley Middle Level Select Choir, all annual events.

Emily is married to Samuel Martin and both are longtime members of Arvada Mennonite Church. They have one son, Moses, who is currently attending Broomfield High School, and sings bass in YVP!

Dan Graeber is a Colorado native who has performed with many area vocal and theater groups, and is currently music director at Christ the Servant Lutheran Church in Louisville. He graduated from CU Boulder last spring with degrees in English and Economics, and minors in Math and Actuarial Studies.
